Commission Counsel's Report

The UC is prohibited from funding any type of affordable housing thru our revenue by FL statutes/laws as well as our bond covenants. This will be communicated to NSB Commissioner Randy Hartman who raised the idea at last meeting between the UC & CC.

New Business

- **a. Scheduled Public Hearings** will be held in June & July on special EV charging rates and on increased costs for proposed Street Lighting.
- **b.** Presentation on Electric Vehicles and Infrastructure / Preparing for the Future Anticipated growth of EVs from 6 M last year to over 18.7 M by 2030. The first local charging stations will be located at Palmetto Street Advent Health in October, soon followed by City Hall, Coronado Civic Center. Live Oak Culture Center and the main parking lot on Canal will come later. Shell Chargers are the vendor. 80% of charging is done at home by current EV owners

Commissioners Comments

- ➤ **Comm. Smith inquired about rebates** specifically regarding Air Conditioners and was told existing rebates are still available at https://www.ucnsb.org/conservation-programs
- ➤ Chairman Davenport inquired about status of UC relocating Fleet facility from Swoope site. GM-CEO indicated it will be probably 1.5 to 2 years before completion of UC relocation. The City can use that area for additional boat trailer parking following relocation.
- ➤ Chairman Davenport also inquired about status of septic to sewer specifically Silver Sands and was told that funding from City or County for Aqua Golf (City) and Silver Sands (County) will move on to grant writing stage with today's approval of Consent Item d. Engineering will meet within 2 weeks to discuss all UC projects with the grant consultant. Chairman Davenport suggested that County Councilman Danny Robins is very supportive of water conservation projects and getting septic tanks off the water.
